- I. Tenting and Bedding with Tommy and Sly**
 - A. TAKE NOTES
 - B. Need 2 tents and gear
 - C. Tents
 - A. Good vs bad
 - B. Proper location
 - 1. Wind
 - 2. Water
 - 3. Widow makers
 - C. Use ground cover and stakes
 - D. Organized
 - E. Saves time
 - F. Keeps things dry
 - B. Bedding
 - A. Sleeping bag, pad
 - B. Store rolled up
 - C. Clothesline

- I. Dining Area and Kitchen with Esther Posthole**
 - A. TAKE NOTES
 - B. Proper set up of patrol box
 - 1. Patrol kitchen
 - 2. Wood tools box???
 - II. Properly set up dining fly
 - A. Tables end to end
 - B. Meals served family style
 - C. No buffets
 - D. Say grace
 - III. Proper stove location
 - IV. Proper food storage
 - A. Everything returned to quartermaster
 - V. Proper trash storage and disposal
 - A. Lids firmly on trash cans
 - B. Location of dumpster
 - G. Duty roster
 - H. Name tags, including for guests
 - I. Centerpiece
 - J. Hat racks; stave holders

VI. Fire Building and Cooking

- A. TAKE NOTES
- B. NO UNATTENDED FIRES -- EVER
- C. Explain propane stove
 - 1. OBEY ALL PROPANE RULES
 - 2. Stove on metal stands only - never on picnic tables
 - 3. Do NOT mess with tank or hose
 - 4. Stake stove stand
 - 5. Adult will set up stove first time
 - 6. Turn off gas at tank when not in use
 - 7. Participants may light stoves for meals
 - 8. Clean & close stove when not in use
- VII. Dutch oven cooking
 - A. Use only the fire starters provided
 - 1. Will be in plastic bags
- VIII. Patrol campfires
 - A. Safety circle
 - B. Collect and store dry wood

IX. Sanitation with Nasty Elmo

- A. TAKE NOTES
- B. Always use fresh water
- C. WASH - RINSE - SANITIZE
- D. Must have clean up water heating during the meal
- E. Proper use of bleach
- F. Proper way to dry dishes
- G. How to dispose of dishwater
- H. Dishes must be put away properly
- I. NO grease pits
- J. Garbage cans
 - 1. Off ground
 - 2. Empty to dumpster DAILY
- X. Latrine cleaned daily
 - A. Hose down, scrub and sanitize
 - B. Post rotation on duty roster
- XI. Shower
 - A. Times
 - 1. After breakfast
 - 2. After evening program and before lights out
 - B. Each person should leave area clean
 - C. Service patrol responsible for daily cleaning

XII. Food Quartermaster

- A. TAKE NOTES
- B. Food pick up times
 - 1. Need to be responsible
- C. How items will be provided
 - 2. How to make special requests
- D. EVERYTHING is returned to Quartermasters
- E. MENUS-read twice, prepare once
- F. 3-4 guests for every meal
- G. ALL MEALS MUST BE SERVED ON TIME
 - 3. Say a grace before meals (a Scout is reverent)
- H. Everything provided needs to be served
 - 4. Serve all at one time
 - 5. Serve family style -- NO BUFFETS

XIII. Equipment Quartermaster

- A. TAKE NOTES
- B. Mrs. McConnell will need 5 minutes for First Aid
- C. Explain what has been provided in each patrol site
 - 1. Give a written inventory to one patrol member
- D. Explain patrol is responsible for care and cleanliness of all equipment
- E. Explain how to get extra or special needs
- F. Demonstrate Ax Yard, have tool rack
- G.
 - 1. Three ring binder (Patrol Book)
 - 2. Meals and food pick up times
 - 3. Propane rules
 - 4. Equipment list
 - 5. Service and program patrol responsibilities
 - 6. General rules and information
 - 7. Responsibility of patrol leader
 - 8. Turn in with equipment at end of week
