First

"High expectations"

We expect the best of each Scout here. And you should expect the best from every staff member.

Set your standards high reach as far as you can.
We all made the same promise. "On My Honor, I will Do my best" That's really what its all about.

"Strong Motivation"

We have high expectations that each of you is here to learn to be the best you can.
