Goal - gain respect of adults by constant responsible actions.
Patience and courtesy will help a lot.

- Deal in solutions, not problems.
- Think before speaking.
Be sure the brain is engaged before the mouth is put in gear.
- Be sensitive to the moods and priorities of adults
- Use common courtesy.
- Make the adult think the idea was his.
